Requirement for Voters

You must show a valid photo and signature ID when voting early or at the polls on Election Day. Voters who do not show a valid photo and signature ID must vote a provisional ballot (F.S. 101.043 (2)).

- Veteran Health Identification Card Issued by the United States Department of Veteran Affairs
- A License to Carry a Concealed Weapon or Firearm Issued Pursuant to S. 790.06
- Employee Identification Card Issued by any Branch, Department, Agency, or Entity of the Federal Government, the State, a County, or a Municipality

Signatures on mail ballots are checked against your most recent signature on file. Update your signature by completing a voter registration application and delivering it to the Supervisor of Elections Office.


