CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE XVII, SECTION 2

METHOD OF REVISING CONSTITUTION. Proposing an amendment to Article XVII, Section 2 of the State Constitution providing that any revision of the Constitution as adopted by convention shall be submitted to the electors at the next general election.

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE VIII, ADDING SECTION 6A

EDUCATION, Terms and Employment of Appointive Superintendents of Public Instruction. Proposing an amendment to Article VIII, Adding Section 6A of the State Constitution providing in counties authorized to appoint a Superintendent of Public Instruction, the Superintendent shall serve at the pleasure of the Board provided that the Board may enter into a contract of employment which shall not extend beyond the Thirtieth day of June in the year in which the terms of a majority of the Members of the Board shall expire; providing that the Superintendent shall not be commissioned by the Governor, but shall be required to file bond.

HILLSBOROUGH COUNTY - Giving electorate power to provide for consolidation of municipal and county governments of Hills-borough County. Proposing an amendment to Article VIII, adding section 24 of the State Constitution, providing that the electors of Hillsborough County be granted the power to adopt a Charter for a government which shall exercise any and all powers for county and municipal purposes which the Constitution or the Legislature has conferred upon the county, or any municipality therein; preserving to the electors of Plant City and/or Temple Terrace the right to consolidate the governments of those municipalities with the consolidated government of Tampa and Hillsborough County by a majority vote of the electors of Plant City or Temple Terrace, respectively; providing for a charter to become effective only upon ratification by a majority of electors of the county voting.

Proposing an amendment to Article V, Section 7, adding Subsection (4), of the State Constitution providing that the Legislature may require County Judges to be a Member of the Florida Bar in counties by special acts subject to referendum; providing that such law shall not affect the term of office or the re-election of any County Judge holding office on the date of its enactment.
