CHARTER AMENDMENT #1

Article III, Section 3.03 labeled "Election and Terms," provide for a term of office of four (4) years and providing a schedule of implementation of said term commencing with the 1999 election which shall be for three (3) years for seats 1, 3, and 5 and thereafter for a term of four (4) years for each subsequent general election.

Article IV, Section 4.01 labeled "Mayor's term of office and power" providing the Mayor's term of office shall coincide with the general election date and for a term of office of four (4) years commencing with the year 2000 general election.

CHARTER AMENDMENT #2

Article III, Section 3.08 labeled "Limitations" is amended to add a new section - Subsection (c) which provides and states:

Section 3.08 - Limitations of General Powers and Duties

(c) Interference with administration. Except for the purpose of official inquiries and investigations, the Mayor, the Council or its members shall deal with City Officers and employees who are subject to the direction and supervision of the Manager solely through the Manager, and neither the Council nor its members shall give orders to any such Officer or employee, either publicly or privately.

REFERENDUM

NON-BINDING REFERENDUM PROPOSING A 1/2 MIL AD VALOREM TAX INCREASE FOR WATER QUALITY IMPROVEMENTS

The City of Crystal River has identified a need to improve and maintain the water quality of the Crystal River within City boundaries. To accomplish this goal, City Council proposes to fund these projects through a five (5) year, 1/2 mil ad valorem tax. Annually, in a public meeting, the City Council will establish a list of water quality projects. Council will then prioritize these projects and establish a budget to accomplish this goal.
