CHARTER AMENDMENT 1

Article II, City Council, Section 2.03, Duties of the Mayor; Ordinance Procedures, be amended to reduce from 4 to 3 the votes required by the City Council to override the Mayor's veto power so that a vote of the majority of the 5 member Council shall prevail in such override.

CHARTER AMENDMENT 2

Article V, General Provisions, Section 5.07, Sale, Leasing or Subleasing of City Property, be amended to reduce from 4 to 3 the votes required in order for the City to lease or sublease real property belonging to the City, so as to only require a vote of the majority of the 5 member Council for such purpose.

Shall the above Charter Amendment be adopted?

CHARTER AMENDMENT 3

Article V, General Provisions, Section 5.08, Transfer of Property, be amended to reduce from 4 to 3 the votes required in order for the City to sell, alienate, or convey real property belonging to the City, so as to only require a vote of the majority of the 5 member Council for such purpose and reducing the number of required appraisals from two (2) to one (1) prior to the sale of City-owned real property, if the real property's value is less than Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

CHARTER AMENDMENT 4

Article V, General Provisions, Section 5.09, Vacation, Abandonment, etc., of Streets, be amended to reduce from 4 to 3 the votes required in order for the City to vacate, abandon, discontinue, close, or otherwise dispose of an easement, street, alley, or right-of-way located within the City limits, so as to only require a vote of the majority of the 5 member Council for such purpose.
