<p align="center">NO. 1 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE I, SECTION 2</p> <p align="center">Declaration of Rights</p> <p>Proposing an amendment to the State Constitution to delete provisions authorizing the Legislature to regulate or prohibit the ownership, inheritance, disposition, and possession of real property by aliens ineligible for citizenship.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO</p>	<p>Requires Legislature to provide a property tax exemption for real property encumbered by perpetual conservation easements or other perpetual conservation protections, defined by general law. Requires Legislature to provide for classification and assessment of land used for conservation purposes, and not perpetually encumbered, solely on the basis of character or use. Subjects assessment benefit to conditions, limitations, and reasonable definitions established by general law. <p align="center">NO. 2 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE I, NEW SECTION</p> <p align="center">Florida Marriage Protection Amendment</p> <p>This amendment protects marriage as the legal union of only one man and one woman as husband and wife and provides that no other legal union that is treated as marriage or the substantial equivalent thereof shall be valid or recognized.</p> <p>The direct financial impact this amendment will have on state and local government revenues and expenditures cannot be determined, but is expected to be minor.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO</p>	<p align="center">NO. 6 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE VII, SECTION 4 ARTICLE XII, NEW SECTION</p> <p align="center">Assessment of Working Waterfront Property Based Upon Current Use</p> <p>Provides for assessment based upon use of land used predominantly for commercial fishing purposes; land used for vessel launches into waters that are navigable and accessible to the public; marinas and drystackes that are open to the public; and water-dependent marine manufacturing facilities, commercial fishing facilities, and marine vessel construction and repair facilities and their support activities, subject to conditions, limitations, and reasonable definitions specified by general law.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO</p>	<p align="center">CHARTER AMENDMENT 1</p> <p>Title Appointment to the City of Crystal River Charter Review Committee requires the consent of at least four (4) of the five members of the City Council</p> <p>Explanatory Statement A vote of "yes" would approve an amendment to the City Charter which would require that appointments to the Charter Review Committee be appointed by a supermajority, that is at least four of the five members of the City Council.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO</p>
<p align="center">NO. 3 CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT ARTICLE VII, SECTIONS 3 AND 4 ARTICLE XII, NEW SECTION</p> <p align="center">Changes and Improvements Not Affecting the Assessed Value of Residential Real Property</p> <p>Authorizes the Legislature, by general law, to prohibit consideration of changes or improvements to residential real property which increase resistance to wind damage and installation of renewable energy source devices as factors in assessing the property's value for ad valorem taxation purposes.
